For selection of a TECHNICAL SPECIALIST (ST/1 position)

within the Project Management Unit for Integrated Nutrient Pollution Control Project

Ministry of Waters and Forests seeks recruitment of suitable staff to cover the Project Assistant position with an employment contract for a limited period within the Project Management Unit (PMU) responsible with the implementation of the World Bank (WB) supported Additional Financing of the Integrated Nutrient Pollution Control Project (INPCP-AF). Through the Additional Financing the overall development objective of the Project became to support the Government of Romania towards meeting the EU Nitrate Directive requirements at a national scale. The proposed interventions will build on the successes and lessons learned from the initial Project as well as from similar projects in Europe and Central Asia and other regions.

Background

The Component 1 "Investments in Local Communities to Reduce Nutrient Pollution" provides support for effective investments and management practices to reduce nutrient pollution from agricultural, livestock and human sources. The beneficiaries (the administrative - territorial units - ATUs - or association of ATUs) will propose sub-projects, selected from a menu of investments based on agreed eligibility criteria and having the main objective to reduce water pollution with nutrients, in accordance with the provisions of the "Guideline for procedures to be used for competitive financing and for potential Applicants". The menu of investments includes: 1. investment for livestock waste management (1.1. developing local community storage, composting and handling systems, packing/pelleting stations and biogas facilities, all to promote better management of livestock waste; 1.2. upgrading the existing manure storage and/or composting facilities); 2. Investment to mitigate pollution by wastewater (sewage and wastewater treatment activities); 3. Improving water bodies' protection against nutrients and soil runoff (planting of forest shelter belts). Under this Component, the financial support provided by the Additional Financing of the Project will be demand-driven, supported on competitive grounds, based on the beneficiary communities' requests and eligibility. The beneficiaries will propose sub-projects, selected from the menu of investments mentioned above and based on agreed eligibility criteria and having the main objective to reduce water pollution with nutrients. For the approved sub-projects, between PMU and ATUs will be concluded the financing contracts for which the PMU staff will assure

the implementation, monitoring and evaluation activities, based on guiding principles and rules for implementation of the sub-projects at the local, regional and national levels.

General Description:

- a. The Technical Specialist is responsible for the implementation and monitoring of subprojects under Component 1.
- b. The Technical Specialist is subordinated and will report to the Technical Coordinator of Component 1..

The individual employment contract will be concluded for a limited period of time, until 31.03.2022.

The minimum required qualifications are:

- academic education in engineering or economics;
- a background of at least 5 years in implementation/management of construction projects;
- practical experience in the field of monitoring and evaluation of construction projects;
- sound knowledge of World Bank's monitoring and assessment exigencies and procedures and experience in working with World Bank are a plus;
- relevant experience in producing various reports to a large number of institutions;
- advanced PC skills and sound knowledge of the MS Office package: MS Word, Excel, Access, Outlook, Power Point;
- good capacity to communicate with people from different backgrounds and positions, as well as with local and national authorities;
- good command of spoken, written and read English is a must;

The selection process will be held in accordance with World Bank selection of consultants: "Guidelines: selection and employment of consultants under IBRD loans and IDA credits & grants by World Bank borrowers".

The selection of the candidates will be carried out on the basis of the assessment of files and supporting documents and the suitable candidates will be contacted by phone/e-mail for the interview.
